
FROM STRENGTH TO STRENGTH



making the NBL1 South All-Star 5.








BIG V MVP


We got a chance in the first week of the finals to seek revenge on Nunawading who beat us both times during the regular season, with one of those in controversial circumstances,

IMPROVEMENT THE HIGHLIGHT








EAGER TO LEARN

WORKED ON TEAM GOALS






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CAME HOMEWITH A CHAMPIONSHIP!




SUPPORTED ONE ANOTHER!




EMPHASIS ON IMPROVEMENT




WILLINGNESS TO LEARN


SETTING TEAM GOALS



It has been a great privilege to coach these young athletes this year. They all improved their basketball, listened and took on all the advice that was given to them by coaching




A REWARDING EXPERIENCE






CONSISTENCY THE KEY





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
SOLID PROGRESS


VERY STRONG FINISH!






